1. Welcome and Check-in

2. Announcements & Updates

- Portrait of a Graduate (POG) Implementation: Bilingual posters and brochures are available
 for distribution. Response has been incredibly positive. They have connected with nearly all
 superintendents in Sonoma County. There are still questions regarding how to
 operationalize POG. If you have groups that would be interested in hearing about POG,
 please contact Dan Blake in order to set up a presentation. The Career Technical Education
 Foundation is leading the community engagement effort. Council on Aging featured an
 article in their newsletter encouraging seniors to support young people in a variety of ways.
- Our Kids Our Future Update: The goal is to look at sustainable funding solutions to support Cradle to Career work. They are looking into a tax on plastics and are conducting a poll this week.
- Equity in Education Initiative Update: The potential launch date is Saturday, March 28th at Sonoma State University.
- iAttend Update: They are working on getting a self-assessment tool for schools and districts to address chronic absenteeism.
- Cradle to Career Goal 1 Team Approach Update: Rather than having monthly meetings, they are moving towards ad hoc groups and project-specific meetings.
- Communications Committee Update: The initial plan was very ambitious and they are now implementing a more strategic approach.
- YouthTruths Update: They are very excited about the level of interest and engagement around this project. The Career Technical Education Foundation is working to secure needed funding.

3. Cradle to Career Advocacy

Karin Demarest will be moderating the candidate's forum on January 16, 2020 at the Glaser Center in Santa Rosa. The next step is to generate questions for the candidates. The Cradle to Career group brainstormed and came up with potential questions around mental health and health-related issues, housing, workforce, equity, and education policy.

4. Supporting Cradle to Career Goals

- The Santa Rosa Metro Chamber of Commerce is looking for support around a potential childcare facility. They are in the early stages of these conversations and will be meeting next week to try and identify key partners.
- The Hanna Institute will be hosting a number of events in the upcoming months that are particularly relevant right now, as our community endures another disaster. The Hanna Institute Summit is scheduled for January 29-31, 2020. It is an immersive, three-day conference focused on learning and sharing new and proven approaches to trauma-informed care. Additionally, Hanna Institute is hosting an evening event on December 5, 2019 with Rhythmic Mind, where Founders Max Kline and Jonah Scott will demonstrate

- how teens and young adults engage in their own empowerment and inspiration through Group Process, Lyric Writing and Beat Production. By integrating a variety of therapeutic modalities including narrative, solution focused, somatic, Dialectical Behavior Therapy, and transpersonal, Rhythmic Mind engages the mind, body and spirit to facilitate a holistic process of healing and transformation. - During the November Cradle to Career meeting, the group will brainstorm areas of focus
 and pressing needs in education for the 2020-2021 school year. Karin Demarest will
 incorporate recommendations at the Grants Committee meeting for the Sonoma County
 Vintners Foundation. There is opportunity for Cradle to Career to encourage Fund the
 Future to think about kindergarten readiness as a focus. Are there 3-4 things Cradle to
 Career can call out? Probably in the READY (Road to Early Achievement and Development of
 Youth) data. Are there 3-4 areas in the County? Maybe Cradle to Career can give a
 presentation to their Board or the Grants Committee.
